Reardon Clean Sweeps Tasmania

Tasmania may have turned on perfect weather to welcome Round 2 of the Australian Motocross Championship to Penguin Race track on the weekend, but Dan Reardon turned up and created a winning storm onboard his KX450F in the Pro Open Class.

Continuing to build on his 2007 winning momentum, Dan hit the well prepared clay Penguin track still pumped after winning Round One at Broadford in Victoria the previous weekend.

After qualifying fastest, Dan stayed true to his winning form and dominated every aspect of competition onboard his perfectly tuned KX450F.

Winning the event outright, Reardon finished Race One 28 seconds ahead of Daryl Hurley and 33 seconds ahead of Cody Cooper in Race Two.

Reardon's result secures him a 28 point Pro Open Championship lead over Daryl Hurley and a 31 point lead over Jay Marmont in third.

"It was great to get a good start and win the hole shot in the opening race," said Reardon. "I put in hard laps early so I would pull a good lead over the field and I was really committed to putting in good lap times throughout the race. Unfortunately our timing system wasn't working in Race One, so I don't know what my early lap times were. I do know I finished with a good gap over Hurley though."

"In the second race, I again got a jump from the start line to win the hole shot and pulled a good lead early. I had a few dramas when lapping riders, as I had to work hard to get around them cleanly which was quite difficult on the clay track. But I finished strongly, with a solid gap back to Cooper in second."
