## Reardon Wins On New Murray Bridge Track

Kawasaki Racing Teams man of the moment, Dan Reardon, continued to put on race winning performances for green supporters, at Round Five of the Australian Motocross Championship, at Murray Bridge in South Australia, Australia, over the weekend, wrapping up the Pro Open program in true Reardon style.

Reardon qualified fastest for race one and won both Pro Open races, extending his championship lead out to 228 points - 31 points in front of second place, Daryl Hurley.

"It was good to come away with another round win and put Kawasaki on the podium again," said Reardon. "I was a little off my game by not winning the hole shot in both races, but I was quick to make amends and get back to the lead.

"In race one, I went into the first corner in about eighth place, but as I had great race pace, I quickly charged through to take the lead. I think I rode just a little too comfortably. I crossed the line 16 seconds in front of Hurley though, which was still a good result.

"In race two, I had to take evasive action going into the first turn, after Matt Moss went down in front of me, and I was close to being caught up in his accident. I quickly regathered my race strategy and caught up to the top three.

"By the third lap, I was challenging for the lead. I made good moves on Hurley and Marmont, and overtook them whilst under brakes through a turn. From there I just rode my own race and came home 5 seconds in front of the field," Reardon said.
