Reardon Builds On Title Lead

Dan Reardon's 2007 Motocross Title campaign, continued to gain momentum at Round Eight of the Australian Motocross Championship held at Wonthaggi in Victoria, Australia, over the weekend.

The three times Australian Supercross Champion looks on track to add the 2007 Australian Motocross title to his list of achievements, as he increased his title lead to 60 points - despite being weighed down with the flu.

"I definitely wasn't feeling at the top of my game over the weekend, as I was sick with the flu, but I still managed to build on my point's lead which is great," said Reardon. "Anything can happen during racing, so it is important that I continue to make inroads on the point's tally if I want to secure my first ever Motocross Title, and Kawasaki's first Motocross Title in seven years.

"Qualifying went well and I posted the fastest lap time of the session, a 1.48:757.

"In race one, I had a good lead over Cody Cooper in the early stages of the race, but I had a big off after getting all crossed up when landing the table top jump at the start-finish line. I hit the ground really hard and was launched over the front of my bike, but managed to get back on and salvage third place in the race.

"I came out in race two and got a good start. I was out in front and riding comfortably by the third turn and had really good race pace onboard my 450. I had one moment in the race where I stalled my bike whilst negotiating a turn, but it restarted first kick and I held onto my lead. From there I just worked on producing good lap times by keeping a consistent pace.

"At this point in the season it is all about championship points and I am happy that I have a sound point's buffer over Daryl Hurley in second place."
